RECIPES FROM THE SPRING RETREAT

Bacon Cheeseburger Chowder

2 cans cream-style corn

4 cups diced potatoes

½ lb diced bacon or bacon pieces

1 cup sliced carrots

1 lb. ground beef

½ cup diced onion

½ cup butter

1 cup sliced celery

4 cups half & half or milk

1 tsp salt

2 cups Velveeta cheese

¼ tsp pepper

½ cup flower

Place first 6 ingredients in a kettle, cover vegetables with water (I used chicken stock)

(just enough to cover Veg). cook until vegetables are tender. Once tender add corn.

While vegetables are cooking fry bacon & break into pieces, Brown ground beef & Drain.

Make a white sauce in the microwave of butter, half & half or milk, cheese & flour. Pour over vegetables. Stir often so it thickens evenly. Add bacon, ground beef, stir to mix. Serve

Cracker Barrel Meatloaf

For Meatloaf

1 tbs olive oil 1 medium yellow onion finely diced 1 green bell pepper finely diced

45 Ritz Crackers crushed 2 large eggs whisked 1 cup cheddar cheese

½ cup whole milk 1 tsp kosher salt ¼ tsp ground pepper 2 lbs 80% ground beef

For the Glaze

2/3 cup ketchup 2 tbs brown sugar 1 tsp yellow mustard

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line baking sheet with parchment paper lightly greased.

Heat the olive oil in medium pan over medium heat, add onion, bell pepper & cook until tender stirring often then remove from heat & let cool. In large bowl mix together Ritz crackers, eggs, cheese, milk, salt, pepper until combined, add bacon, ground beef & cooked onions, peppers. Mix with your hands till well combined. Shape mixture on prepared pan & bake 30 minutes. (if mixture feels too loose add more crackers)

Glaze: In small bowl stir together ketchup, brown sugar & mustard.

After the meatloaf cooks 30 minutes, spoon the glaze on the meatloaf coating it evenly. Bake another 30 minutes or until cooked through. Cool for 10-15 minutes before slicing.

Cinnamon Sugar Pretzel Sticks

Yield(s): Serves 12-14 10m prep time 15m cook time

Ingredients

- 16oz bag of pretzel sticks
- ¾ cup butter, melted
- 1 ½ teaspoons vanilla
- 1 egg white
- 1 1/4 cup white sugar
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon
- Optional: ½ teaspoon cardamom

Preparation

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. In a large bowl, melt the butter and then let cool for 5 minutes.
- 3. Once butter has cooled, add the egg white and vanilla then mix until smooth.
- 4. In a small bowl, mix together the cinnamon, sugar, and cardamom (if using). Set aside.
- 5. Add the pretzels to the large bowl and toss in the butter mixture until fully coated. Slowly sprinkle the sugar mixture over the pretzels and gently toss until completely coated.
- 6. Transfer the pretzels to the prepared baking sheet and spread into an even layer.
- 7. Bake for 16-18 minutes, stirring the pretzels half way through.
- 8. Let pretzels cool before breaking apart and serving.
